Important Benefit Information You Need To Know

<u>1095-Cs</u>

As required by the Affordable Care Act, the SoNM provides 1095-C forms for full-time, benefitseligible employees who are offered health insurance benefits through the SoNM. The form is a detailed report of offered benefits and employee's medical coverage enrollment status during the previous year.

The SoNM will provide each employee with a 1095-C form by March 2, 2021. All employees will receive their 1095-C documents via mail using the home address listed in SHARE. **Please ensure your information is correct.**

If employees do not receive the form by March 2, 2021, or if any information on the form is incorrect, employees should e-mail the Employee Benefits Bureau (EBB) at <u>GSDRMD.EBB@state.nm.us</u>, or call 505.827.0447 to leave a voicemail with first and last name, address, agency, employee ID#, phone number and issue. Please place "1095- C" in the subject line if emailing.

Special Rules for Health & Dependent Care FSAs

On December 21, 2020, Congress passed a COVID-19 stimulus bill giving permission for the State of New Mexico (SoNM) to allow the carryover of health and dependent care Flexible Spending Accounts (FSAs) funds from 2020 to 2021.

This means participants in health and dependent care FSAs can carry over <u>any remaining unused funds in their accounts</u> into the next plan year 2020 to 2021, and 2021 to 2022.

Typically, the "use-it-or-lose-it" rule states that at the end of the plan year, any unused funds remaining in a member's medical or dependent care FSA are to be forfeited. As a practice, the Risk Management Division (RMD) has always allowed a grace period for health FSAs (up to March 15th of the new year to incur new claims against previous year funds, and up to March 31st to submit the necessary paperwork for that claim). Now, with Congress's Covid-19 **temporary rule**, employees are granted a *temporary* reprieve from the forfeiture rule.

Moreover, this temporary rule also allows employees to adjust their 2021 pledge amounts. Members who established their health and/or dependent care FSA pledge amounts during the 2020 Open Enrollment period can now adjust their pledge amount to accommodate any carryover of unused 2020 FSA funds; they will now begin the 2021 plan year with an available balance that includes the unused 2020 account funds. In other words, Participants will now have more money in their 2021 FSA health and/or dependent care accounts due to the carry-over of 2020 funds. Therefore the SoNM is allowing participants to lower (or increase) their 2021 pledge if they so choose.

The Risk Management Division will apply this temporary rule as requested by members so our employees can use the money they already prime for health and dependent care and not lose it due to circumstances beyond their control.
